#### **2004 ANNUAL DINNER**

A Celebration of Extraordinary Achievements

n May 18, 2004, over 900 WBA members and supporters gathered for the WBA & WBAF Annual Dinner, From the Right to Vote... To Winning the Vote: Women in Leadership. The Great Hall of the National Building Museum was filled with women and men assembled to celebrate the history, accomplishments and future of women in the legal community and, in particular, those elected to public service.

Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton (D-New York) stirred great excitement as she made a special appearance and offered brief remarks during the general opening reception where she paid tribute to her former ABA col-

league, Cory Amron, the 2004
Woman Lawyer of the Year.
Senator Clinton was the first
chair of the ABA Commission
on Women in the Profession from
1987–1990 and worked closely
with Amron, who followed as the
next chair of the commission.

In her welcoming remarks, WBA President Paulette
Chapman spoke proudly of the progress women have made in the political arena. "Women bring so much to the table, we bring common sense, we know how to seek a consensus and we know how to govern," Chapman remarked.

Among the many delights of the evening were the remarks of U.S. Senator Debbie Stabenow

(D-Michigan) who offered the keynote address. With a balance of history, humor and humility, Senator Stabenow spoke of the pioneering women who founded the WBA, and of her own experience as the first woman Senator from the State of Michigan. Poignantly, the Senator remarked that while it is important to recognize women who are the firsts to achieve leadership positions, "I have always said that if there is not a second, and a third, and a fourth...then being first is really only a token." Senator Stabenow concluded with a heartfelt reminder about women's place in politics. "While there are certain issues that impact us differently, every issue is a women's issue."





#### CONVERSATION WITH BETTY MURPHY

n April 22, 2004, WBA 1987
Woman Lawyer of the Year,
Betty Southard Murphy, was
presented with the American
University, Washington College of
Law (WCL) "Women and Law
Leadership Award" at WCL's fourth
annual Women and Law Leadership
Luncheon. Mrs. Murphy, a partner at
Baker & Hostetler LLP, was honored
for her tremendous contributions to
WCL and the legal community.

Mrs. Murphy's remarkable legal

career includes her distinction as the only person to have served as both Chairman of the National Labor Relations Board and as Administrator, Wage & Hour, at the U.S. Department Labor, both of which are sidential appointments. Mrs. Murphy received five additional Presidential appointments to special commissions, including the Commission on the Bicentiennial of the U.S. Constitution. She is the only lawyer in private practice ever elected to the prestigious National Academy of Human Resources.

Mrs. Murphy currently serves as an adjunct professor at WCL. She has served on the Board of Trustees for American University, the Dean's Advisory Council, and many special event committees. She is the sponsor of three named scholarships and awards for students at WCL.

In presenting Mrs. Murphy with the award, WCL Dean Claudio Grossman celebrated her accomplishtions and applauded her contributions to the legal community: "I am

pleased that the law school will honor one of our most outstanding graduates, Betty Southard Murphy, as the 2004 Women and the Law Leadership Award recipient. Mrs. Murphy has and will continue to forge success for not only women but all people in the workplace. She is a role model for our community for her knowledge, expertise and commitment to the highest values in the legal profession." 
President Chapman then passed the WBA gavel to Joanne W. Young, who inspired the crowd with her warm remarks.



#### WOMEN LAWYERS

#### Leadership Problems and Solutions

s we continue to climb the ladder in corporations, law firms, and government, senior women often become increasingly less assertive, more formal and more riskadverse. These surprising findings are the results of a nationwide research study of Fortune 500 and other senior executives with salaries of \$150,000 and above. The study, conducted by The Leader's Edge, shows that a woman's ascent in the corporate world is often accompanied by a dramatic and unexpected shift in her havior...a shift that often proves detrimental to future career advancement. The research study identifies striking behavioral differences between senior female executives and their male counterparts, as well as with more junior females, in a number of critical areas.

While networking skills continually increase in importance for men, these skills become less important to women. Sixty-six percent of women believe networking skills to be important while 75% of men believe this is a critical factor.

Although 73% of more junior executive women believe self-promotion is a critical factor, this figure decreases to 50% for women in higher positions. On the flip side, self-promotion preases in importance for men as they advance.

Communication style is also a key area of differentiation. The study shows that women, in general, are less assertive in meetings than are men. Women tend to temper assertiveness as they rise in the organization, believing it puts them at risk. Only 69% of women are comfortable with challenging thinking compared with 82% of men.

There is also a broad division of thinking between women and men in the utilization of mentors. Eighty percent of women surveyed view the role of mentors as protectors, rather than agents of advancement. Women tend to utilize their mentors passively and defensively, for protection and information, rather than for assignments and visibility. The majority of successful men (77%) state that they increasingly utilize their mentors to obtain plum assignments and further their careers.

Women tend to become increasingly reliant on formal meetings to influence senior management, compared with their male counterparts and junior executive women. In fact, only 15% of junior executive women cite formal meetings as the most effective vehicle to influence senior management compared with 28% of senior executive women. We believe these findings are important to share with women in corporations, law firms, and government positions.

Why are senior women making such dramatic adjustments to their behavior? The study indicates a continuing double standard between men and women in the workplace, where the very behaviors that are rewarded and encouraged in men are often considered as negative attributes in women by peers and senior male executives. As a result, women who stay in the corporate environment are becoming conditioned through their experiences to shift their behaviors in order to sustain themselves in high-level positions.

This is not to suggest that women should behave more like men to effectively climb the corporate ladder. On the contrary, women need to learn how to play their own game better.


