

Ellen Spencer Mussey and Emma M. Gillett







- The WBA was founded in 1917 by 31 visionary women lawyers at a time when women largely could not own property, could not vote, could not serve on juries, and could not join the local bar association.
- WBA Founders Ellen Spencer Mussey and Emma M. Gillett also established the Washington College of Law (now part of American University) after the the law school of Columbia College refused to educate women as lawyers because they "did not have the mentality for law." WCL was the first law school in the world founded by women.
- On May 17, 1917, Mussey and Gillett convened the group of 31 founding members to create "a Women's Bar Association of the District of Columbia."





- 1981: Established as WBA's philanthropic arm.
- Mission: support nonprofits serving the legal and related needs of women and girls in the DC metropolitan community.
- **Grant Program**: \$75,000
- Founder's Fellowship: \$7,500
